Indigenous knowledge possessed by First Nations peoples comes from living on the lands and waters of their traditional territories. It derives from a traditional way of life that has been passed down through the generations from the beginning of time.

Over the past 35 years Dr. Lytwyn has worked with Indigenous people from many communities in Ontario and other parts of Canada and the U.S. Some of that work has involved interviewing elders and listening to their stories.



This presentation will provide glimpses into the Indigenous knowledge of three Ontario First Nations: Walpole Island First Nation, Wabigoon Lake Ojibway Nation and Sagamok Anishnawbek.
